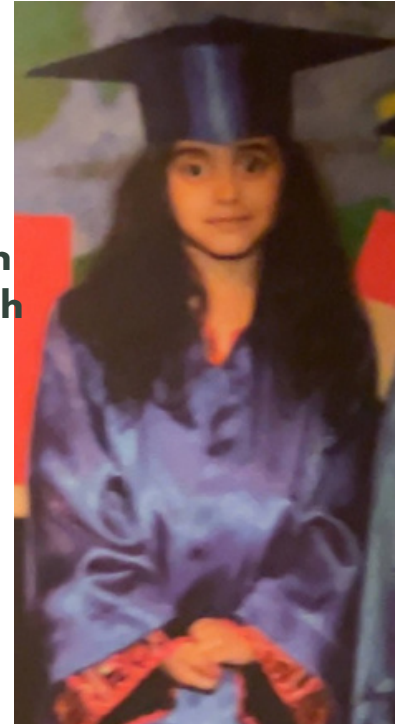


A MESSAGE FROM THE EDITOR-IN-CHIEF FATIMA AL KUWARI
