










Bahrain has been ranked 23 among the 100 safest countries around the world in terms of the Covid-19 pandemic, according to an international report. The kingdom has received a Tier Two safety ranking as part of a study, titled 'The 100 Safest Countries in the World for Covid-19', which ranks a combined 200 nations and regions, divided into four tiers.






Bahrain has recorded its highest daily tally of new Covid-19 cases and recoveries, bringing the total number to 15,417.





Health authorities have once again warned the public to adhere to precautionary guidelines to limit the spread of Covid-19.Health Ministry Under-Secretary Dr Waleed Al Manea said cases continue to increase due to recklessness.He revealed that the spread among Bahrainis was higher due to people being reckless and attending family gatherings, while the rise among expatriates is due to not properly following social distancing measures.

OCTOPUS

The giant Pacific octopus is truly something magnificent. With three hearts, nine brains, and blue blood these eight-armed creatures are nothing short of extraordinary. One main brain controls their nervous system with eight smaller brains controlling each of their eight arms. Two hearts pump blood to their gills with one larger heart circulating blood to the rest of the body. They can also camouflage for protection when hunting for food and release a toxic ink when alarmed.

SCIENCE

EPILEPSY MEMORY STUDY

Our brains use distinct firing patterns to store and replay memories, in a study of epilepsy patients, researchers monitored the electrical activity of thousands of individual brain cells, called neurons, as patients took memory tests. They found that the firing patterns of the cells that occurred when patients learned a word pair were replayed fractions of a second before they successfully remembered the pair.

WALT DISNEY

Walter Elias Disney (December 5, 1901 – December 15, 1966) was an American entrepreneur, animator, voice actor and film producer. A pioneer of the American animation industry, he introduced several developments in the production of cartoons. As a film producer, Disney holds the record for most Academy Awards earned by an individual, having won 22 Oscars from 59 nominations. He was presented with two Golden Globe Special Achievement Awards and an Emmy Award, among other honors. Several of his films are included in the National Film Registry by the Library of Congress.
