Following consideration of a report submitted by the National Medical Taskforce for Combating the Coronavirus (COVID-19), the Government Executive Committee approved measures aimed at mitigating the spread of COVID-19 by closing non-essential sectors and activities

From Thursday 27 May 2021, at 23:59, to Thursday 10 June 2021, at 23:59, the below decisions will be implemented, and are subject to review, as follows:



Closure of shopping malls and commercial shops



Restrictions of restaurants and cafes to delivery and takeaway only



Closure of gyms and sport halls, swimming pools, beaches, and recreational centres



Closure of cinema halls

Ban on events and conferences



Ban on attendance to sporting events



Closure of salons, barber shops and beauty parlours



Barring social gathering at homes



Work-from-home policy to cover 70% of Government employees



Suspending in-person learning at schools and higher educational institutions, kindergartens, rehabilitation centers, nurseries and training centers, with the exception of attendance for international examinations



Current travel procedure to the Kingdom of Bahrain to remain in effect





Bahrain's Updated COVID-19 Guidelines

The current activities remain in effect:



Hypermarkets, supermarkets, and grocery stores



All bakeries



Fuel and gas filling stations



Private health clinics, with the exception of some health services for which a circular is issued by the National Authority for Regulating Health Professions and Services



Banks and currency exchange services



Administrative offices of institutions and companies, whose activities are not directly related to customers






Bahrain Just Increased the Capacity of Daily Vaccine Shots to 31K

Amid the rising cases on the island, The Minister of Health, Her Excellency Faeqa Saeed Al Saleh announced the expansion of the Kingdom's National Vaccination Campaign. Bahrain will now be able to provide 31,000 vaccination doses a day to curb the spread of COVID-19. The National Vaccination Campaign has requested 4.5 million doses of all types of approved vaccines to cover requirements for 2021-2022.








Bahrain fourth on global vaccination list

Bahrain ranks fourth among countries with the highest rates of Covid-19 vaccine distribution compared with the number of population, according to British daily The Times.

A total of 170,433 people received the vaccine, making up 10 per cent of the kingdom's population.







WHO approves Sinopharm vaccine in potential boost to COVAX pipeline

A WHO emergency listing is a signal to national regulators that a product is safe and effective. It also allows it to be included in COVAX, a global programme to provide vaccines mainly for poor countries, which has hit supply problems. The WHO had already given emergency approval to COVID-19 vaccines developed by Pfizer-BioNTech, AstraZeneca, Johnson & Johnson and, last week, Moderna.

CBB announcement: extension of loan deferral

The Central Bank of Bahrain directs retail banks to postpone loans for a period of 6 months, starting from June 30, and to include all citizens, residents and SME's. Loans were deferred from March last year until August without bank charges under a BD4.3 billion stimulus package.

They were deferred two more times under optional deals in which interest was calculated from August last year until June this year.
