Effective Today, Bahrain Removes 11 Countries From Its COVID-19 Travel Red List

Covid-19 has caused uncertainty around the world, with people still trying to keep up with the new normal. Bahrain as a country has managed to win the battle against the pandemic with extraordinary measures and commendable efforts by the authorities and the general public. The Civil Aviation Affairs has updated its list of red list countries in accordance with directives issued by Government Executive Committee in response to the recommendations made by the National Taskforce for Combatting the Coronavirus (COVID-19). Effective today, 11 countries have been removed from the travel red list including, The Republic of South Africa, Republic of Namibia, Republic of Uganda, Republic of Mozambique, Republic of Zimbabwe, Republic of Malawi, People's Republic of Bangladesh, Republic of Indonesia, Republic of the Union of Myanmar, Republic of Georgia, and the Republic of Ecuador. While Romania has been added to the red list.

Luxury resort surrounded by wildlife sanctuary to open on Baharain's Hawar Island

A luxury resort with overwater villas is set to open on Baharain's Hawar Island.

Located a 45-minute boat ride away from Baharain, Hawar Island is on the tentative list of UNESCO world heritage sites for its natural history. Mantis Baharain Hawar Island Hotel & Resort, which will have 72 rooms and suites, will be surrounded by a wildlife sanctuary – becoming one of the first environmentally focused projects in the Middle East. Guests will get to explore the island's biodiversity, which includes sand gazelles, Arabian oryx, coral reefs, and dugongs. Alongside the sanctuary, the resort will also be home to an adventure park, a water park, a tennis court, and a bike track, plus five restaurants.

As a Mantis property, the project will be developed in a sustainable and environmentally aware way, with initiatives to reduce the use of water and reuse biodegradable food waste. Accor has partnered with Edamah (Baharain Real Estate Investment Company) to launch the property, which is set to open in 2024.

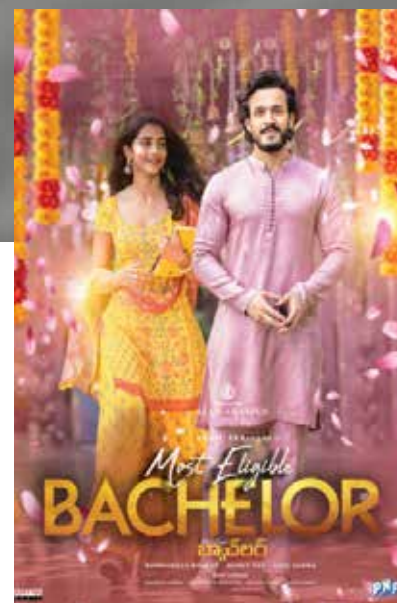
