

A series of new measures has been implemented by the Government Executive Committee to combat Covid-19. This includes continuation of closure of cinemas, fitness centres and salons. Restaurants and cafes will continue to open only for takeaway and deliveries. People across Bahrain have also been urged to wear face masks in public. The ban on public gatherings of more than 5 people will continue. Commerical and Industrial stores that provide services and goods to customers will be allowed to operate under strict guidelines. While the private sector has been instructed to implement remote working. These measures, among others, will be enforced from April 9 until April 23. The Executive Committee is chaired by His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, Crown Prince, Deputy Supreme Commander and First Deputy Premier.



**Drive-through COVID-19 Testing Centre Opens** 



Citizens and residents will be able to visit a drive thru COVID 19 Testing Center at the Bahrain International and Exhibition Center.



The first batch of tracking bracelets has been made available for Covid-19 medical or home quarantine cases by the Information and eGovernment Authority (iGA).



People opting to stay in hotels during their assigned quarantine period for the Coronavirus Disease (Covid-19) will not be allowed to leave the facility in the first 14 days nor will they be allowed to receive visitors, according to the Health Ministry. A patient can leave the place once a nasopharyngeal swab taken on day 13 turns out negative. However, people are free to extend their stay in quarantine if they wish to do so for further safety.

Wearing face masks in public places has been made mandatory as part of enhanced measures to combat the Coronavirus Disease (Covid-19). Everyone, whether sick or healthy, must wear a surgical or homemade face mask while going to public places, announced health officials at a Press conference.







More than one million face masks have been made available in Bahrain, it has emerged. The Industry, Commerce and Tourism Ministry said stocks were supplied to pharmacies and supermarkets yesterday.





There is a high level of awareness about precautionary measures to limit the spread of Covid-19 among people in Bahrain, a new survey has found.

A total of 10,546 respondents, of whom 53 per cent were women, were surveyed by the Bahrain Centre for Strategic, International and Energy Studies (Derasat) including people of different age groups and educational backgrounds.
