## 3,300 tests a day in Bahrain

A young Bahraini university student is taking part in a campaign in the UK to 3D print face shields for medical personnel on the frontline battling the Coronavirus Disease (Covid-19). Sami Alshaibi, aged 21, is studying International Business at the University of Strathclyde in Glasgow.


He joined the 3DCrowd campaign, which started in England on March 23, as one of more than 6,000 volunteers making thousands of plastic face shields to be distributed to hospitals, GP practices and social care organisations.

With more than 30000 volunteers have registered on the e-volunteer platform since its launched on 15 March 2020, 70 voulnteers are taking part in inspection campaigns organised by the Industry, Commerce and Tourism Ministry. According to the ministry's resources and services assistant under-secretary Abdulaziz Al Ashraf, the volunteers were needed to help inspectors given the current circumstances which have led to an increased need for extensive larger scale inspections.
