A call has gone out to people in Bahrain to curtail their Ramadan activities, especially during Iftar and family gatherings, to help contain the spread of the coronavirus (Covid-19). In addition, authorities announced that all non-essential shops will be closed from 7pm tonight until 7pm on May 7.

During the holy month, expected to begin on Friday, no majlises, ghabgas, Iftars or gargaoun will be permitted, while distribution of Iftar packets on roads and setting up of donation kiosks in public places will be banned.

The flag of Bahrain shines the Swiss Matterhorn in solidarity with international efforts to combat the Corona epidemic




The Swiss Matterhorn is lit by the flag of Bahrain, as an expression of solidarity with countries and people of the world in combating the Corona pandemic.
