HEADLINE Vaccine Trial Target Reached





The Crown Prince yesterday thanked his 6,000 fellow volunteers as Bahrain reached the target for the third phase of Covid-19 vaccine clinical trials.

His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, Crown Prince, Deputy Supreme Commander and First Deputy Prime Minister, said the continued determination and unity of the kingdom's citizens and residents in supporting national efforts to combat the coronavirus remains central to overcoming challenges presented by the pandemic.

He said the contribution of his fellow volunteers from Bahrain in reaching their volunteering target, was both noble and charitable, showing great humanity and compassion.

A total of 6,000 people hailing from different nationalities have volunteered for the vaccine clinical trials. The Health Ministry yesterday announced the target has been reached, six weeks after the trials got underway in Bahrain.

*The target number of volunteers for phase three clinical trials of a potential Covid-19 vaccine in the country has been increased by 1,700, it was confirmed yesterday. The new development was officially announced by National Taskforce for Combating Coronavirus (Covid-19) monitoring committee head Lieutenant Colonel Dr Manaf Al Qahtani at a Press conference.

Banks Cannot Charge Fees On Loan Defferal





The Central Bank of Bahrain (CBB) has clarified that no fees, except insurance, can be charged by lenders on the four-month loan deferral for Bahrainis and local companies.

The GDN has received a copy of fresh guidelines issued to banks, finance and microfinance companies by the regulator yesterday.

This comes a day after it was reported that banks had agreed to waive loan instalments from September until the end of the current year, provided that interest on the amount and administrative fees will have to be paid during the postponement period.

The CBB circular yesterday said no fees must be charged to customers for providing loan deferment option, except for additional insurance fees resulting from extension of the loan tenor.



WASH YOUR HANDS FREQUENTLY
