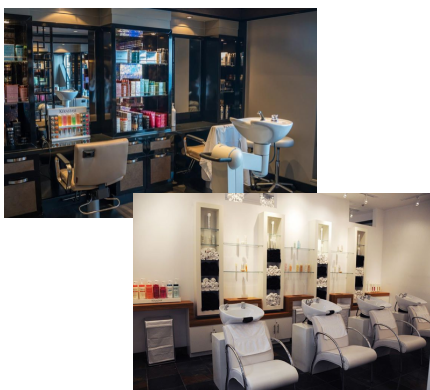

 **The following treatments are currently prohibited:**

- Facial treatments
- Using a hairdryer
- Hair treatments that require the use of a hair dryer (Keratin treatments, Brazilian blow-out, protein etc.)
- Threading
- Microblading
- Using needles
- Spa services, such as, massages, oriental baths (Moroccan baths, Turkish baths, etc.)
- Henna tattoos
- Make-up application services
- Tanning services
- Applying lashes
- Applying returnable hair extensions

Haircutting

- Before performing a haircut, all female customers must have their hair washed at the salon and all male customers must have their hair wetted by water sprayers.
- Use disposable towels to dry off excess water from hair if needed.
- Hair must be cut while it is still wet/damp to reduce the transport of fine, dry hairs onto air currents.
- Cloth aprons should be replaced with disposable paper or plastic aprons.

Shaving

- Only disposable razor blades can be used. Blades must be discarded after each customer.
- Clippers must be sprayed with disinfectants containing at least 70% of alcohol before and after each use.

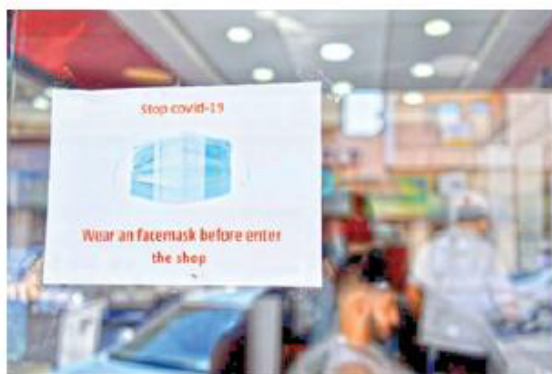
Salons, barber shops re-open, with low customer turn-out reported

Salons, barber shops and beauty parlours re-opened yesterday after a roughly two-month ban, which was imposed as part of measures to help mitigate the spread of the coronavirus (COVID-19) disease.

All such establishments have been required to strictly follow a series of new guidelines, issued by the Ministry of Health and Ministry of Industry, Commerce and Tourism, for the health and safety of both staff members and customers.

Management from a number of men's barber shops said that they had been preparing extensively under the new protocols and have been forced to raise

their prices by 500 fils, due to the costs of the health and safety requirements.

Several salons and barber shops also reported a low turn-out on the first day of returning

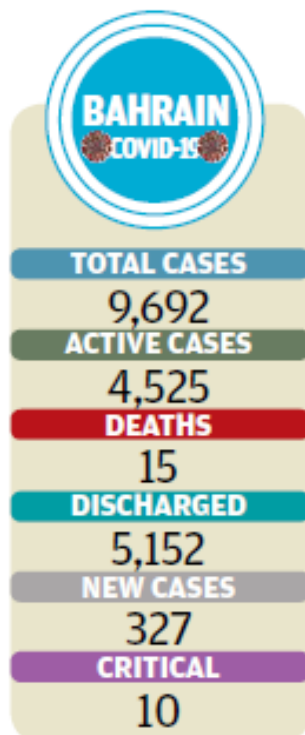
to business, saying that, despite the strict guidelines being implemented, many are still con-

NHRA lists 11 private hospitals offering COVID-19 testing



NHRA lists 11 private hospitals offering COVID-19 testing

A list of 11 private hospitals in the Kingdom that have been licensed to conduct coronavirus (COVID-19) testing was released yesterday by the National Health Regulatory Authority (NHRA).

These private hospitals may conduct

testing on patients suspected to be infected with the virus or those who are asymptomatic, at their request.

The 11 hospitals include Middle East Hospital, American Mission Hospital, Awali Hospital, Al Kindi Specialist Hospital, Royal Bahrain Hospital, Ibn Al Nafees Hospital, Bahrain Specialist Hospital, Dr.

Tariq Hospital, Noor Specialist Hospital, King Abdulla Medical City and Al Salam Specialist Hospital.

The fees for these tests are to be determined by the private hospital, and they should be between BD40 and BD50.

Tests provided in these private hospitals are in accordance with the guidelines

and standards approved by the World Health Organisation and the national medical team combating the coronavirus.

The NHRA said recently that the health institutions will conduct the tests within the hospital premises and then send the collected samples to public health laboratories, where the results will be made known.

The private tests come within the framework of contributing to the national efforts to limit the spread of COVID-19 in the Kingdom of Bahrain.

Testing provided by the Ministry of Health continue to be available, free of charge, for both citizens and residents in Bahrain.

Middle East Hospital, American Mission Hospital , Awali Hospital , Al Kindi Specialist Hospital , Royal Bahrain Hospital , Ibn Al Nafees Hospital , Bahrain Specialist Hospital , Dr. Tariq Hospital , Noor specialist Hospiatl , King Abdulla medical City and Al Salam Specialist Hospital

The Fees should be between BD 40 and BD 50.

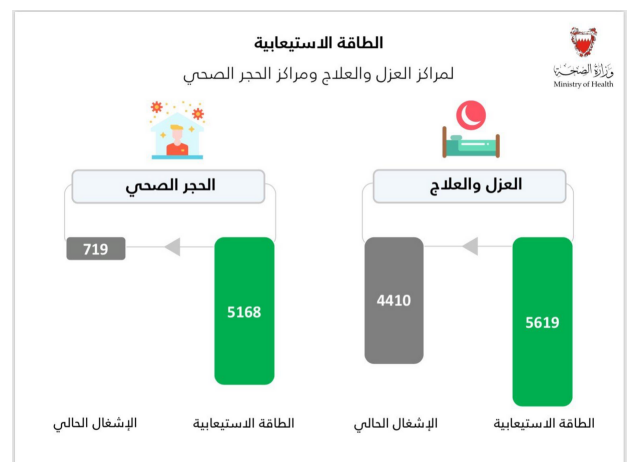
